## **Highlights From Our Reports and Recommendations 2019-20**

# Youthwatch & School's tal Health Forum

In 2019 Healthwatch launched Youthwatch with a group of 14 pupils from John Kyrle High School in Ross on Wye. We met with them at lunchtimes most weeks for a term. The Youthwatchers chose a topic to research and explore. With our guidance they designed, developed and undertook a survey on the transition to high school and mental health with their peers in year 7. The findings have led to improvements to their school handbook. Youthwatch also created 3 videos interviewing local **GP Dr Simon Lenanne about medical** topics, and a video all about the Youthwatch experience, which we will use to promote to other schools.

#### **8 Children & Young People's Mental Health**

We sought views from 417 young people in 2019 through a range of surveys, events, focus groups and allied Herefordshire schools. We held a work on the NHS Long Term Plan and Crucial Crew 2018 & 2019.

#### We made the following

#### recommendations:

- Utilise more peer support models to help children and young people's mental health
- Better initiatives to address bullying
- Consider the physical environment support is delivered in
- Improve information and communication between agencies
- Consider effective whole school mental health models to develop consistent approaches

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# 🕌 💐 Children's Crucial

In 2019 we gathered views from 1775 year 6 pupils age 11 across workshop as part of a multi-agency safety fortnight. We asked children to tell us about their views of transitioning up to high school, and what would help them to address any concerns they may have.

#### Schools Forum

## **Improving Living with Dementia in Herefordshire**

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The views and experiences gathered from the public about living with dementia published in April 2019 have been included in the development of a Herefordshire and Worcestershire wide strategy.

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Over the last year we have been championing these recommendations at a county wide dementia partnership board, the dementia action alliance.

We will continue to support our statutory partners and the reconstituted **Dementia Action Alliance to progress** the recommendations in our report.

## **Shaping Non Emergency** Patient Transport

In 2019 Helathwatch took part in the panel for evaluating tendering for the new patient transport service across Herefordshire and Worcestershire.

We were able to ensure that listening to local patient feedback is an essential part of the service that is provided.

## Making Sure People Are Involved In Planning and **Reviewing the Development of Mental Health** Services

Herefordshire and parts of Worcestershire have received extra funding to be a community mental health pilot site. Healthwatch have been involved in helping to involve the public voice in this work so far.

In 2019-20 Healthwatch have worked closely with mental health services as it changes provider to the Worcestershire Health and Care Trust. We want to ensure Herefordshire services are shaped by your views.

Healthwatch have taken part in feedback sessions in 2019-20 so the NHS can develop a new mental health strategy for Herefordshire and Worcestershire. We used your feedback to us from the NHS Long Term Plan engagement.

# **Enter and View**

Enter and View is a Healthwatch statutory power. In March 2019 our staff and volunteers visited the following hospital clinics; trauma, radiology and orthopaedics, ear, nose and throat, and urology and rheumatology. We listened to the experiences of patients or residents and their family and collated our findings to make recommendations.

In May 2019 we published our report summarising the views of 165 patients. We shared our findings with the Wye Valley Trust and also at a Herefordshire and Worcestershire conference on outpatients redesign.

## **Care Quality Commission**

The CQC is responsible for inspecting health and social care services. We meet with them regularly to share experiences of services. This informs their inspection programme, for them to improve quality and safety for patients.



# End of Life Care - Continuing to have Impact

Our work on end-of-life care in 2017-18 has continued to have an impact on how care is delivered in the county. As well as being awarded a highly commended certificate for this work by Healthwatch England in 2018, in April 2020 a new pathway for end of life care in the county, with a 24/7 coordinated hub, has been launched. This was one of the key pieces of feedback received, recommended in our report. We held a focus group in 2019 to talk to the public about these new plans.

# **NHS Long Term Plan Engagement**

In 2019 Helathwatch Herefordshire led an engagement project across Herefordshire and Worcestershire in partnership with Healthwatch Worcestershire.

We asked the public for their views about planned initiatives concerning specific aspects of the NHS 10 year plan published in January 2019, across the following 8 topics:

- **1.Children and Young People's Mental Health**
- 2. Adult Mental Health
- **3.Autism and Learning Disability Services**
- 4. Local Out of Hospital Care
- 5. Emergency Same Day Care
- **6.**Specialist Services
- 7. Health Inequalities

8. Prevention & Self-care

We published themes from our findings in June 2019. This feedback was used by the health system across Herefordshire and Worcestershire to develop local plans required by NHS England, describing how service initiatives can be developed locally.

# Improving Cancer Services

Since December 2018, we have held 3 focus groups in partnership with the Living Witha dn Beyond Cancer programme at the hospital. Feedback from patients and carers at these events, have shaped the addition of the following services for people livinf with and beyond cancer; An hollistic needs assessment, treatment summaries, exercise referal scheme, Expert cancer patient's programme, specialised psychlogical support.

# **Providing Information and Advice** on Health and Care

in 2019-20 89 people contacted us for individual information and advice about their local health and social care services, for help in finding their way around often complicated systems, or to give us their views and experiences of services.
